

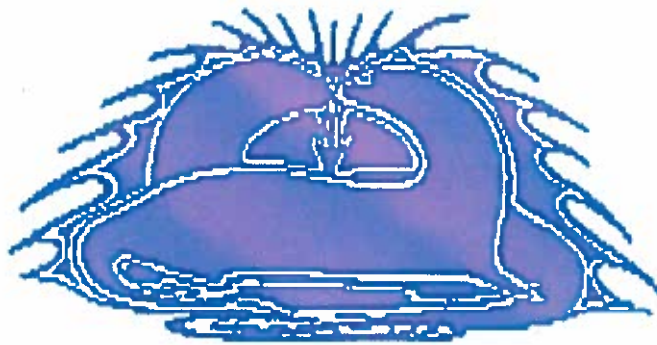

STOP stands for Smoking Treatment for Ontario Participants. If you have ever thought about quitting, or if you aren't ready to quit but would like to reduce the number of cigarettes you smoke, this program is for you.

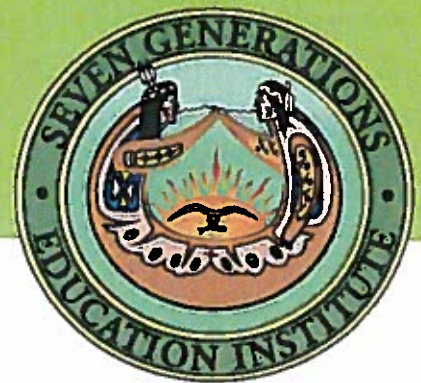

## Do I Qualify?

In order to qualify for the Driver's Training Program, you must:

- Be Aboriginal, Inuit, or Metis
- Be age 16 or older
- Be unemployed and looking for work or going to school
- Have no driving infractions/outstanding driving fines
- Have a valid social insurance number
- Have a valid status card (if Aboriginal)

## Identification

You will need your permit in order to attend the Driver's Training classes. If you plan on getting your permit with us, you will be required to have one of the following combinations of identification:

- Passport
- Ontario Photo Card
- Birth Certificate (original) and Ontario Health Card
- Birth Certificate (original) and Status Card
- NEW Status Card
