



Canadian Navigable Waters Act

Nigigoonsiminikaaning First Nation hereby gives notice that an application has been made to the Minister of Transport, pursuant to the *Canadian Navigable Waters Act* for approval of the work described herein and its site and plans.

Pursuant to paragraph 7(2) of the said Act, Nigigoonsiminikaaning First Nation has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Common Project Search Registry (<http://cps.canada.ca/>) under the NPP File Number 2022-406133 a description of the following work, its site and plans:

- The construction of a treated effluent outfall and associated piping within Rainy Lake. The outfall is to be placed approximately 220 m from the shore at a depth of approximately 2.7 m beneath the approximate median water level (337.18 m). The outfall will be located at approximately 48°42'6.95"N 92°55'55.61"W.

The outfall pipe will be sunk to the southeast of the shore where it will then be installed via trenching and excavation in front of Nigigoonsiminikaaning First Nation (Rainy Lake 26A) in Rainy Lake District.
